Title I Annual Parent Meeting: Partnering for Student Success

Each year, schools that receive Title I funds host an Annual Parent Meeting to share important information with families. This meeting is an opportunity for parents, guardians, and community members to learn more about how Title I supports our schools and students.

The meeting consists of:

- An overview of Title I and how federal funds are used to improve teaching and learning for all students
- A review of the school's Title I program and goals, including how funds support instruction, materials, and family engagement opportunities
- Information on academic standards and testing, and how schools measure student progress
- An explanation of parents' rights under Title I, including the right to be involved in decisions about their child's education
- Details about the School-Parent Compact, a shared agreement between families, students, and teachers to support learning at home and school
- Opportunities for family involvement, from volunteering in classrooms to joining school committees or providing feedback on programs

Family and community involvement are at the heart of Title I.

When schools and families work together, students benefit from stronger support, higher achievement, and greater opportunities for success.
